WAYNE LIBRARY ASSOCIATION

Revised By-Laws

September 2018

ARTICLE I Name:

Section 1 The name of the corporation shall be the "Wayne Library Association".

Section 2 The name of the library shall be the "Annie Louise Cary Memorial Library".

Section 3 The Annie Louise Cary Memorial Library shall operate as a free public library.

ARTICLE II Membership:

Section 1 Any individual 18 years of age or older shall become a member of the Wayne Library Association upon payment of the annual dues, and his <u>or her</u> name shall be entered in the record of that year's membership.

Section 2 Voting privileges at the Association's annual meeting shall be restricted to those who have paid their annual dues and to those who have made a donation to the library, in money or in kind, equal to or exceeding the annual dues <u>and have requested membership and provided the contact information necessary for membership.</u>

ARTICLE III <u>Dues</u>:

Section 1 The dues shall be determined by the <u>board once a year at the last regular</u> <u>meeting preceding the annual meeting.</u> <u>membership at each annual meeting.</u>

ARTICLE IV Board of Trustees:

Section 1 The number of Trustees shall be nine. They will shall be elected for a term of three years by a majority of the members present at the annual meeting. The election shall be held in such a manner that three Trustees will be elected each year. The trustees' terms shall be staggered so that no more than three Trustees are elected at each annual meeting.

Section 2 A quorum of Trustees is required to vote on measures. Five Trustees shall constitute a quorum unless vacancies reduce the number of Trustees, in which case a quorum shall be a majority of the remaining Trustees.

Section 2 3 Vacancies occurring on the board <u>during the fiscal year, between annual meetings</u> may be filled by a majority vote of <u>a quorum of</u> the remaining Trustees, <u>even though less than a quorum of the Trustees</u>. The <u>Each trustee filling a vacancy shall be elected to complete the term of the now vacant position.</u>

Section 3 4 The Board of Trustees shall have supervision of all properties of the Association and the management of all its affairs; it shall make all rules and regulations for the administration of the library; it shall appoint a librarian, assistant librarian and other employees as may be deemed necessary, and set the compensation paid to them for services rendered. The Board of Trustees shall have the authority to remove an officer or an employee by majority vote at any regular or special meeting of the Board. The Board of Trustees shall have the authority to schedule a special meeting of the membership for a vote by the membership to remove a Trustee. At the special meeting of the membership, the membership may remove a Trustee by majority vote.

Section 4 <u>5</u> Regular and special meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be held at such time and place as provided by resolution of the Board of Trustees, and unless otherwise decided by a majority vote of the Trustees, shall be open to the membership. The time and place of regular and special meetings that are open to the public/membership shall be posted on the library web site.

Section 5 A majority of the Trustees shall constitute a quorum unless otherwise specified by these by-laws.

ARTICLE V Officers and Treasurer:

Section 1 The officers of this Association shall consist of a pPresident, a vVice-pPresident, and a sSecretary, and a treasurer. All officers The president and vice president shall be elected each year at the first board meeting following the annual meeting by a majority of the Board of Trustees from their own number. The secretary and treasurer shall be elected each year by a majority vote of the members of the Association present at the annual meeting. All officers shall hold office until their successors are duly elected. The tTreasurer shall be selected by the Board of Trustees.

Section 2 The President shall be the principal executive officer of the Association. In general, h He or she will shall supervise and control all of the business affairs of the Association,

subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees; <u>he or she will he or she shall</u>, when present, preside at all meetings of the membership and Board of Trustees, and may also sign checks. <u>He or she shall be responsible for all notices required by these by-laws.</u>

Section 3 The Vice-President shall assume all the duties and responsibilities of the <u>pP</u>resident in the absence of the <u>president</u> and shall have the authority to sign checks, should the <u>President</u> be absent or unavailable.

Section 4 The Secretary shall act as clerk of the corporation and shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the members of the Association and the Board of Trustees and a copy of any document submitted at said meetings. He or she shall see that all notices required by these by-laws are duly given; shall keep a register of names and addresses of all members; shall maintain a file of all the business of the Association, including correspondence file and shall perform such other duties as prescribed by the Board of Trustees.

Section 5 The Treasurer shall deposit all funds received to the appropriate accounts and shall have the authority to write checks and disburse funds to pay for bills and expenses incurred in the normal course of business and authorized by the annual budget. The Treasurer shall keep proper books of account, showing all monies funds received and disbursed. Said books shall be open at all times to examination by the Board of Trustees. He or she The Treasurer shall maintain current records so as in order to report monthly to the Board of Trustees on the current financial status of the Association; and shall report the preceding year's transactions at the annual meeting of the Association. The Treasurer shall keep a register of names and addresses of all members; shall maintain a file of all the financial business of the Association, and shall perform such other duties as prescribed by the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE VI Nominating Committees:

Section 1 Nominating Committee

- The nominating committee will shall be comprised of three of the membership who shall be appointed by the president and may include the President.
- It will be the duty of the <u>The</u> nominating committee <u>shall</u> to select a slate of <u>three persons</u> three candidates from the membership as candidates for election to <u>serve on</u> the Board of Trustees <u>at the annual meeting</u>. It will be their further duty to select candidates for the offices of secretary, treasurer and auditor.

Section 2 It will be the duty of the nominating committee to select a slate of three persons from the membership as candidates to serve on the Board of Trustees. It will be their further duty to select candidates for the offices of secretary, treasurer and auditor.

Section 2 Finance Committee

- The Finance Committee shall be comprised of at least three board members and may include the president. Members will be selected by the Board of Trustees during the first regular meeting of the fiscal year.
- The Finance Committee shall assist the Treasurer with day-to-day activities as needed, develop the budget for presentation to the Board of Trustees, and maintain a correspondence file including but not limited to financial documents guided by the Document Retention Policy.
- Meetings shall be held on at the request of the treasurer or when required by the Finance Committee or the Board of Trustees.

Section 3 House Committee

- The House Committee shall be comprised of at least one board member and two or more additional members, and may include the President. Members will be selected by the Board of Trustees during the first regular meeting of the fiscal year.
- The House Committee shall manage and oversee the maintenance and repair of all library property including the Annie Louise Cary Memorial Library, Williams House and grounds.
- The House Committee shall develop and implement a maintenance schedule to ensure proper upkeep of all equipment.
- The House Committee shall be responsible to the Board of trustees and shall provide a monthly report of all maintenance activity.

Section 4 Ad-hoc committees may be convened to address specific issues or topics. At the discretion of the board, additional members may be added to committees at any regular board meeting and all committees may include one or more non-board members.

ARTICLE VII Meetings of the members of the Association:

Section 1 The annual meeting of the members of the Association shall be held in October at a date and time set by the Board of Trustees each year to elect officers and Trustees and to transact the business of the Association. Written notice shall be sent to each member by postal mail or e-mail at least seven days prior to the annual meeting. At the annual meeting, the nominating committee shall submit a slate of candidates for election to the Board of Trustees. At the annual meeting, members shall be permitted to submit an alternate slate of up to 3 members as candidates for election to the Board of Trustees, provided that the slate has been submitted in writing, signed by 8 members, to the Board of Trustees, by postal mail only, at least 14 days prior to the annual meeting.

Section 2 Special meetings of the members of the Association may be called at any time by the president of the Association or by a majority vote of the Board of Trustees. Special meetings require by giving written notice of the date, time and place and specific purpose of the meeting to each member by postal mail or e-mail at least seven days prior to the special meeting. the members as required for annual meetings, provided, however nNo business shall be acted upon at such a special meetings other than that which is specifically stated in the notice for said meeting. Members of the Association may request that the Board of Trustees call a special meeting, provided that the request includes the specific purpose of the meeting, is submitted in writing, signed by 8 members, and is sent to the Board of Trustees, by postal mail only, at least 14 days prior to the date of the requested special meeting.

Section 3 At all meetings of the members of the Association, 15 members shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VIII Finances:

Section 1 The Fiscal Year of Wayne Library Association shall begin on October 1 and end on September 30.

Section <u>42</u> All bills of <u>and expenses incurred in the normal course of business and authorized by the annual budget of</u> the Association shall be paid by the <u>£</u>Treasurer. When approved by the Board of Trustees and countersigned by the president of the Board of Trustees. Expenditures greater than \$600.00 that have not been authorized by the annual budget shall require advance authorization in writing by the Board of Trustees. Email authorization shall be an acceptable method of written approval. All other expenditures shall be presented to the Board of Trustees for review at the next regular meeting after funds are disbursed.

Section 23 All funds of the Association shall be deposited in such a bank or banks as are financial institution designated by a majority of the Board of Trustees, in the name of the Association, subject to the draft of the treasurer.

Section 34 All bonds and security belonging to the Association shall be managed by a financial institution selected by the Board of Trustees and governed by the Wayne Library Association investment policy. The Treasurer shall maintain communication with said financial institution and coordinate an annual review for the Board of Trustees. deposited in such bank or with such safety deposit company as may be designated by the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE IX By-Law Amendments:

Section 1 Additions, alterations or amendments may be made to these by-laws at any meeting of the Association by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present. Notice of a

meeting to vote on such amendments, alterations or additions shall be sent to the membership by postal mail or email, with an indication of changes to be made, 7 days prior to the date of the meeting.

ARTICLE X Corporate Seal:

Section 1 The corporate seal of the Wayne Library Association shall be a red wafer seal, over which shall be inscribed: "Corporate Seal, Wayne Library Association."

ARTICLE XI Auditor: Review of Financial Records:

Section 1 An auditor A reviewer shall be elected selected by the Board of Trustees and appointed at the annual meeting of the Association, to hold office for the term of one year.

Section 2 The auditor reviewer shall examine annually the accounts of the Association for the fiscal year just completed. The Treasurer shall provide the records to the reviewer for examination within 60 days of the reviewer's appointment and the reviewer shall submit a certificate of such examination at the annual meeting following the auditor's election to the Board of Trustees in a timely manner.

Section 3 The Board of Trustees shall establish the amount to be paid to the auditor reviewer for his or her services.

ARTICLE XII Compensation of the Board of Trustees:

Section 1 All officers and trustees of the Association shall serve without pay or other compensation, provided, however, that the officers and trustees may be reimbursed, upon approval of the Board of Trustees, for actual expenses made in on behalf of the Association.
